The Sunrise Quartet, Claudia Chudacoff, violin, Teri Lazar, violin, Osman Kivrak, viola, Diana Fish, cello, founded in 1991 and based in Washington DC, has given concerts at the Kennedy Center, National Building Museum, Corcoran Museum, Phillips Collection, Mozart Festival at the World Bank, and Chautauqua Festival at Dickinson College. They have completed a Chamber Music America residency at Duke Ellington School of the Arts where they performed concerts and coached music students. They also perform as the National Gallery String Quartet at the National Gallery of Art. In 2011, they performed an all-Beethoven concert as part of the Gallery's presentation of Beethoven's string quartets. Besides standard quartet repertoire, they present rarely heard masterpieces of chamber music. Program: La Oracion del Torero by Turina, "Dissonant" Quartet in C major, K 465 by Mozart and Piano Quintet op. 57 by Shostakovich with pianist Li-Ly Chang."
